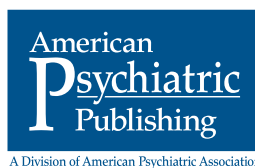

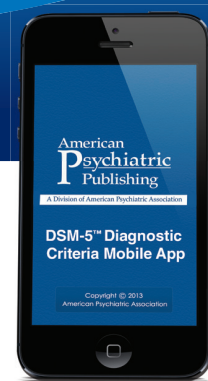

Maternal Influenza Exposure and Bipolar Disorder in Adult Offspring

Substantial research has documented an association between prenatal exposure to infection and schizophrenia, and this study found serologically documented maternal influenza exposure was also associated with a fivefold greater risk of bipolar disorder, but only with psychotic features. These results may suggest that prenatal influenza is a risk factor for psychosis rather than for a specific psychotic disorder.

Excess Mortality in Depression in General Versus Patient Communities

The mechanisms linking depression to mortality were found to be related to biological dysregulations or lifestyle factors rather than disease specific in this unprecedented meta-analysis of 247 studies—which included 105,986 depressed and 578,503 nondepressed participants from 31 countries.

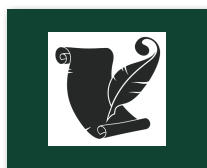

Edward Adamson (1911–1996) was a British artist, pioneer of using art as therapy, and the creator of the Adamson Collection. The Adamson Collection is one of the major international collections of art objects by people with mental health issues. We know from Adamson's book, *Art as Healing* (1984), that the creator of this object, Graham G, found personal relationships difficult. Adamson suggests he was happier in the fantasy world of gnomes, pixies, castles and monsters, which he created during his sessions at Adamson's London studio. The Collection has about 15 of Graham G's ceramics and one painting. In this one, the Sleeping Prince has a garland of red roses around his neck (now faded), a climbing plant growing across his face – a recurring motif, which Adamson called 'tendrils of fantasy' – and a golden eagle emerging from his forehead.
