Recapitulation of Perturbed Striatal Gene Expression Dynamics of Donor's Brains With Ventral Forebrain Organoids Derived From the Same Individuals With Schizophrenia Schizophrenia is a brain disorder originating during brain development. This study uses a "mini-brain" stem cell model of cells from postmortem tissue from patients affected by schizophrenia to study what is different during their development in a dish. These mini-brains recapitulate the altered gene expression found in the same patients' postmortem brains. This demonstrates the validity of the cell model and identifies novel targets for therapy.
