Do psychiatrists and non-psychiatrist physicians interpret the relationship between religion/spirituality and health differently? Curlin et al. (p.1825) surveyed 2,000 US physicians to explore this question and to determine how religion and spirituality is addressed in the clinical encounter. Their findings suggest that the vast majority of psychiatrists appreciate the importance of religion and/or spirituality and appear to be more comfortable, and have more experience, addressing religion/spirituality concerns in the clinical setting.
