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Corrections

In the article “Examining Transcranial Direct-Current Stimulation (tDCS) as a Treatment for Hallucinations in Schizophrenia,” by Jerome Brunelin et al. (*Am J Psychiatry* 2012; 169:719–724), the unit of measure for one component of the sham stimulation was listed incorrectly. In paragraph 3 of the Method section, the final sentence should read “In sham stimulation, the chosen stimulation parameters were displayed, but in fact after 40 seconds of real stimulation (2 mA), only a small current pulse occurred every 550 msec (110 μ A over 15 msec) through the remainder of the 20-minute period.”

In the November 2012 Book Forum, copyediting of the concluding paragraph of *The LGBT Casebook* review by Lawrence Hartmann, M.D. (*Am J Psychiatry* 2012; 169:1215–1216) changed its intent. The review should have concluded:

There is also a startling first sentence. It is the first sentence in the whole book, in the Foreword (and thus perhaps not edited by the book’s editors): “People in the LGBT community are just like everyone else.” Like, yes; just like, no. If that were true, this book would not have been written. The challenge that this good book meets is to deal thoughtfully and respectfully with LGBT people, who are very much like non-LGBT people but also have important differences.
