One comes away feeling that public psychiatry has grown in stature and deserves greater recognition in psychiatry's broad family of subspecialties, no longer the shrinking violet. The editors are commended for recognizing the breadth of talent and experience at Yale and for organizing a succinct and informative text that is very much worth reading.
