The online version of the *Journal* allows you to conduct searches for topics of interest in issues going all the way back to 1844. Plus the only way readers can participate in the *Journal's* new CME Course program is to have an activated online subscription (note: there is an additional annual fee to be enrolled and eligible to receive up to 36 hours of category 1 CME credit).

For APA Members, you will find your member number on the mailing label above your name. It is

a 10-digit number beginning with zeros. Enter your number in the box and click the SUBMIT button.

For Individual Nonmembers and Institutions, your customer number is on the mailing label above your name. It is a 10-digit number beginning with 22 or 30. Enter this number in the box and click the SUBMIT button.

Fill out all the information on the next screen and press the "Send Form" button at the bottom on the right.

When finished, click the "Done" button. You will receive an e-mail confirmation that your subscription has been activated.
