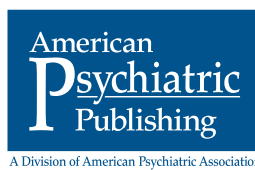

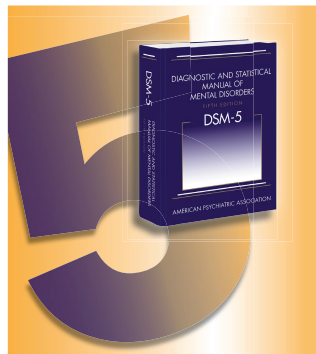

Once a week, over a period of 10 years, I have attended art therapy workshops at the Ameos Hospital Osnabrück, Germany. The art-studio is run by the art therapist Katja Watermann, whose help I greatly appreciate. In 2010, I received a prize for my *Old Woman*.'
