Differential diagnosis is key.

Our understanding of ADHD has evolved from that of a discrete behavioral condition to a complex neurobiologic disorder with various associated comorbidities. <sup>1-4</sup> It is now recognized that ADHD is usually accompanied by coexisting disorders and other complicating factors that may or may not be identified and adequately treated. <sup>5</sup> Overlapping comorbidities can obscure the many faces of ADHD, potentially standing in the way of effective treatment and successful long-term outcomes. <sup>5</sup>


