The Brain's Response to Reward Anticipation and Depression in Adolescence:
Dimensionality, Specificity, and Longitudinal Predictions in a Community-Based Sample

A weak striatal response to reward anticipation was related to subthreshold or clinical depression in adolescents, and it predicted transition to depression 2 years later in previously healthy respondents.

Ziprasidone Augmentation of Escitalopram for Major Depressive Disorder: Efficacy Results From a Randomized, Double-Blind, Placebo-Controlled Study

Adding ziprasidone to escitalopram increases the likelihood of treatment response after a lack of response to escitalopram alone. Adjunctive ziprasidone also has anxiolytic effects. Somnolence or fatigue is a common adverse event.

Greenstein, Ph.D., a student of political psychology, socialization, and leadership, explores popular conceptions of the U.S. President and sums up the research with a series of observations that remain of interest today. An example: "Citizens seem to perceive and evaluate the President as a person, rather than in terms of his policy commitments or his skill in the specialized tasks of leadership."

25 years ago this month: "Children's PTSD Reactions One Year After a Sniper Attack at Their School"

Kathi Nader, D.S.W., and her colleagues find that the highest levels of exposure to the event were associated with more enduring and more severe symptoms. The authors recommend that the children who have the greatest exposure in such events be followed up closely to ensure that they receive the necessary treatment.
