Multimodal Structural Neuroimaging Markers of Brain Development and ADHD Symptoms

A relatively large body of brain-imaging research examines children with attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). For this research to be clinically useful, multi-variate methods are needed that can combine many pieces of information into clinically meaningful data. Gareth Ball and colleagues use such a multivariate approach in an attempt to begin generating clinically useful imaging measures in more than 250 children. Their results provide the beginnings of a path that may one day lead to clinically-informative imaging in ADHD.

Electroencephalographic Biomarkers for Treatment Response Prediction in Major Depressive Illness: A Meta-Analysis

Because electroencephalography (EEG) is relatively inexpensive, researchers have sought to generate EEG-based measures of treatment outcome for major depressive disorder. Alik S. Widge and colleagues report data from a quantitative meta-analysis from 76 articles examining this issue. Their results suggest that the commonly used EEG techniques employed by these studies are not sufficiently well-developed to support their clinical use in predicting treatment outcome. The authors outline methods for addressing this shortcoming.

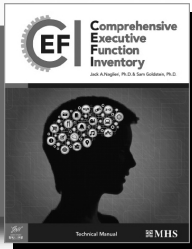
50 Years Ago this Month: Therapeutic Abortion
